Last week we honoured Road Safety Week during our PSHE sessions by completing quizzes, practical demonstrations and holding circle time discussions with the children about keeping safe on and around the roads near the school and our homes. The older children in school also learned about the meaning of various road signs and explored the Highway Code in more detail. Without our crossing patrol, we must work together to keep our children safe on the road outside of school, and so it is encouraged that you park and cross in safe places to model and reinforce our key safety messages with the children.



With that in mind, you may have noticed that the council has resurfaced the road outside the school. Currently the bus bay and no parking yellow zig-zag lines are absent. Please be aware that this restricted parking zone is still valid and the school buses still require clear access. The council will be around to re-instate them in the very near future.

#### Leek Library


Code Club has been running for 9 to 11 years olds from 4 to 4.50pm on a Monday. It is a free event.
