morning learning more about evacuees from our excellent guide Penny. We then worked in groups to prepare and present a drama based around the stages of evacuation, from being informed at



school to settling in with their hosts in the countryside. Well-acted Penguins!

Following lunch we experienced an air raid with Cadence making an excellent ARP Warden. All the Penguins put their gas masks on, got to safety through the blackout and kept



each other company crammed into their shelters waiting for the all clear to be sounded. They then enjoyed the opportunity to put on their cotton gloves and investigate some

real and replica World War II artefacts.

For our final activities we split into smaller groups. Both groups got to complete some rationing activities - identifying foods such as powdered egg and Camp coffee, working out the real and fake wartime meals - is it crow pie OR jellied fish eyes?

Each group also visited a 1940s room complete with rag rugs, radio, taped windows and examples of wartime toys.
