





Why have we decided to use Accelerated Reader?

What Makes a Proficient Reader?*

Proficient readers successfully leave tracks of their thinking when actively reading a text.



Good reading is not just about fluency and accurate decoding of a text.

It is about understanding and making sense of what is being read.

Our curriculum must reflect this. We **teach** and **test** to these skills therefore our reading scheme must also follow these principles.

Also....it does what it says on the tin!

What is Accelerated Reader?

AR is a computer program that helps teachers manage and monitor children's independent reading practice.

Your child picks a book at his/her own level and reads it at his/her own pace.

When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer
- passing the quiz is an indication that your child has understood what has been read.

AR gives both children and teachers feedback based on the quiz results which the teacher then uses to help the child set targets and ongoing reading practice.



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
How do we determine your child's initial reading level?



Children take a test called the STAR READER test.

This is a computer-adaptive reading test which assesses pupil's reading ability and determines a recommended reading level for Accelerated Reader.


It is also used to measure growth over time.



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
Questions 1 - 10

The first ten questions will ask you to pick the best word to fill a gap in a sentence.



Questions 11 - 34

The other 24 questions will give you a few sentences to read and will ask you about what they mean.

How will my child choose an appropriate book to read?

- Free choice - motivational factor.
- However, children must select books that are appropriate for their individual reading level.
- Books are labelled in the following ways to help guide choices:
- **Book Level** - difficulty of text (range 0.1 - 13.5)
- **Interest Level** - Relates to the content and appropriateness- Lower (LY), Middle (MY) and Upper years (UY).
- **Points**- Refers to length and number of words (range 0.5- 118).



A child needs to pass a quiz with a score of 60% or higher to earn points.

What does it mean if my child is not passing quizzes?

- Children have been set up for success as they have been matched with books of the right reading level.
- Quizzes have been written so that they can be passed easily by any pupil who has read the book and understood it at a basic level.
- If a pupil consistently performs poorly on reading quizzes, it almost invariably means that they are not reading or comprehending the reading material.
- We will
 - Sit with the children to help them with their quizzes
 - Listen to readers daily
 - Adjust ZPDs to enable success
 - Reassess using Star Reader every half term



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Rewards and motivational aspects of the scheme

- **Success** - realistic targets that are challenging but attainable ensure children **will** pass their quizzes.
- **Free Choice** - makes reading a much more enjoyable experience as they feel in control and can choose books that are interesting to them.
- 4 x 100% = a small token prize of a bookmark
- 100 % boards in class - raffle tickets for every 100% earned
- Most improved reader each half term - celebrated and rewarded in celebration assemblies (first one this Thursday!!)
- **Word Millionaires Club**
 - Year 2, 3 and 4 = Class Millionaires
 - Year 5/6 - Individual prizes
- Consistent 100% performance - increase in ZPD



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How can I keep track of my child's progress?

You can access your child's AR information in Renaissance Place Home Connect from any web-enabled computer.

Once in the program, you can view your child's progress towards targets, points and books read.

You can also access AR Book Finder to search for titles of interest.

You can only access information about your own child.

How can I support my child with AR at home?

- Practise makes perfect!
- Create a culture of reading in your household by reading with your child, starting a home library, visiting your local library or bookshop on a regular basis and by letting your child see you reading.
- When reading with your child stop and ask questions to be sure your child comprehends what they have read and in general make a habit of discussing books that each of you has read.
- See the comprehension handouts for questions to ask and ideas of activities/ things to discuss with your child.




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How can I support my child with AR at home?

Above all, spend time listening to your child reading. Time spent reading at school (**30 mins**), combined with time spent reading at home (**15 mins**) will equal that magic 35 - 54 minutes!
