

### No Smoking Please!

Of late we have been finding used cigarette butts in the school playground. We would like to reiterate that we **do not allow smoking** on our school premises or grounds and we have asked groups that let our pool and premises to pass this on to their clients.

We also ask that e-cigarettes are not used on school grounds. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

### Free School Meals

Parents claiming some benefits may be eligible to claim free school meals status (FSM) for any school age.

Registering your child for Free School Meals not only provides free healthy meals every lunchtime, it raises funding for the school from the government. This money, pupil premium, is used by the school to offer pupils invaluable additional support and to fund after-school activities.

FSM are available to any family in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit

- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

To check whether your child is eligible you can search <https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals> and then apply on the Local Authority's website.

You can apply at any time, and Staffs County Council will contact you with more information once your application has been accepted.

Thank you for your support and for helping to make sure the school receives as much funding as possible
