Bikeability

The school was filled with bikes this week as some of the KS2 children underwent Bikeability courses run by Cyclist Training Ltd. Their nationally qualified cycling instructors led a Level 1 course where some of our Year 4 children learnt basic cycle skills including bike safety checks, starting and stopping under control, signalling and using gears correctly

while cycling within the school playground. Year 5 & 6 pupils did the Level 2 course where the pupils gained a knowledge of positioning, signalling, negotiating a variety of junctions and general road safety awareness on local school roads.



The children had a great time and learnt a lot as well. It is a wonderful life skill to have allowing children an increased independence as well as offering physical and mental benefits.


Accelerated Reader

How does it work?



Keep up the vaccine push

Staffordshire County Council is urging residents to keep pushing vaccine take up as all people aged 32 and over can now book their Covid jab.

After a successful pop-up clinic in Burton and passing the million doses of vaccine delivered in Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent milestone earlier this month, the Council is asking people to keep up the good work in taking up the jab when eligible.

Concerns over the Indian variant means people over 50 and those with severe underlying health conditions will now receive their second dose eight weeks later instead of twelve.

Ten cases of the Indian variant were found in Staffordshire last week and further testing is currently taking place.

Dr. Johnny McMahon, Staffordshire County Council's Cabinet Support Member for Public Health and Integrated Care, said:

"Thanks to residents efforts and the hard work of staff, partners and volunteers, the vaccine rollout in Staffordshire is going well.

"However, with the emergence of the Indian variant and vaccine invitations quickly moving down the younger age groups, it's vital that we keep building on this momentum."

A recent study from Public Health England suggests having both doses of the vaccine is highly effective against the variant – underlining the importance of people having their second jab.

Johnny added:

"The early studies regarding protection from the Indian variant are pleasing, especially when you have had both doses. So, it's up to us to keep pushing forwards and doing our bit to promote vaccine take up across all our communities and age groups. "

People aged over 32 should book their vaccination without delay by visiting the <u>NHS Book a coronavirus</u> <u>vaccination</u> website.

Information on international travel and children travelling abroad

The government announced that from Monday 17 May, international travel can gradually resume as destinations are added to England's 'green list'. The Government has asked us to remind parents that people should not travel to 'amber' and 'red' countries, and that strict rules on testing and quarantine remain in place to protect public health and the vaccination programme.
