<u>Covid 19</u>

We continue to follow the government guidelines regarding COVID-19 and would like to remind all parents to please continue to adhere to social distancing and the wearing of facemasks unless medically exempt. Please can we also remind you not to congregate at the entrance to the school at drop off and pick up times. Your support and co-operation is much appreciated.

If we are notified of a positive case in our setting then the parents/carers of children who have been in close contact with any individual who tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be contacted immediately once we become aware. All of the children/staff affected will be required to self-isolate for 10 days.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <u>https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test</u> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'. The 10-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature

• a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19
