



Agreed consistencies and experiences

1	<p><i>By the end of KS1, all children will be able to name and locate the 7 continents and 5 oceans of the world.</i></p> <p><i>By the end of KS2, all children will be able to use maps, atlases and globes to locate a wide range of countries, the equator and tropics, the poles and hemispheres.</i></p>
2	<p><i>During Forest School sessions, the children will practice their map reading and compass skills as well as experiencing a range of human and physical geography themed sessions.</i></p>
3	<p><i>Children in all classes will go on seasonal walks 4 times a year where they will make comparisons between the seasons, discuss weather etc. This will also give the opportunity to practice fieldwork skills, mapping, observations and data collection.</i></p>
4	<p><i>Once a year each Key Stage must undertake a fieldwork project within the local area. Class books will be created to document these studies.</i></p>
5	<p><i>Once a year the school will celebrate ‘Geography Day’ where each class will experience a range of practical activities both inside and outside the classroom including topics such as Fairtrade. This could be themed each year to celebrate a particular country or culture.</i></p>
