# Charity supported by Mrs Bradbury and family:

As some of you are aware Mrs Bradbury supports this wonderful charity, and it is one that that is very close to her heart for personal reasons.

The charity collects and shares out presents for children who unfortunately through no fault of their own will be spending Christmas in hospital.

Mrs Bradbury is collecting items that include toys, books, puzzles, dolls, dinosaurs, lego, pencils, colouring books, selection boxes, little crafts sets, puppets toiletries from birth to teenagers etc.

We are asking that the items are new due to the nature of the children's conditions and their low immune systems. Please send smaller gifts that are not too big as many children are bed bound.

Please send them into school by the end of November so that Mrs Bradbury can forward them onto The Amelia Mae Foundation in time for Christmas.

### **Attendance**

We pride ourselves on our excellent attendance data and we are in the top 10% of primary schools in England. At the end of autumn 1 2025 our data for attendance was 97.57%.



The governors, staff and QEGSMAT are keen to ensure that pupil punctuality and attendance is of the highest standard. All state schools are unable to authorise any request for holidays in term time. More information about this is on our website. If you do need to request leave for an exceptional reason, please contact me to discuss your situation beforehand.

Evidence and research show that pupils who arrive in good time and attend school have the very best chances of progress and success. School is open for pupils from 8:45am (unless attending Breakfast Club) and lessons start promptly at 9am. The Government does not set specific attendance targets, but schools are expected to set their own.

An attendance rate of **95%** is generally considered good; this allows for children to miss 9.5 days for sickness/illness across the school year. Persistent absence (PA) is defined as an attendance rate of 90% or below. As previously, the school will send out the attendance data for your child for your information each term.

### Dates for the Year

At the end of this letter, I've set out as many of the dates for the year that we have already have in place. Over the year, more will be added, and reminders will be sent out by staff. A copy of

each newsletter will also be put up in the school notice board. If you would like a paper copy of the newsletter at any time, please drop into the school office.
