Science

In Science, we are learning all about famous Scientists and inventors in history. For this topic, children can create an Inventor interview poster: Children "interview" a famous inventor (e.g., Alexander Graham Bell, Mary Anning, Thomas Edison) by creating a one-page poster with 5 Q&As, a portrait, the invention, the problem it solved, and how it's used today; encourage a household "test" showing the invention in use and a sentence on how it could be improved

History

As our History topic this half term is all about The Stone Age and the transition to the Iron Age, it would be fantastic for the children to have a go at creating a mini Stone Age life museum! Pupils can make a shoe-box display with three labelled items (e.g., a model tool, a cave art panel, and a model shelter or Stonehenge ring), plus a 6–8 sentence fact card explaining hunter-gatherers, tools, food, and shelters; photos of making or a 30-second "tour" video are welcome.

<u>Art</u>

In Art, we are learning how we can use shape and colour to create art. Using only cut paper shapes (circles, triangles, rectangles) and a limited colour palette, pupils build a cityscape or landscape collage showing foreground, middle, and background; include a short note about warm vs cool colours and where they used contrast



Computing/History

As our Computing topic is all about Stop Motion Animation, you could attempt to do your own animation creation. Create a cave-art style scene (charcoal/chalk/brown paper) that tells a simple hunt or travel story, then animate one element (e.g., an animal crossing or a torch flicker) in a 10–15 second stop-motion; submit a photo of the artwork and the short clip. You can use iMovie on Apple devices or Stop Motion Studio on Android.
