TT Rocks Stars



We celebrated the relaunch of our TT Rock Stars Day.

The children looked amazing dressed as rock stars as did the staff.

The children took part in extra maths activities during the day and Mr Bettany who is part of a group played his guitar as the children danced and rocked around the hall.

Times Tables Rock Stars is used in our school from Year to 2 to help your child with their times tables. It is really engaging and fun and your child will be able to complete

The children regularly practice during morning time and Penguins class also do the Rocking and Rolling Numbers songs from their website!

White Tigers children complete a game on 'soundcheck' mode which is the mode that works and looks like the end of Y4 multiplication check. It is out of 25 and we currently have most children getting 20+ with lots of superstars getting 25 out of 25 regularly already!

Their enrichment activity was a fun-filled swimming session co-ordinated and supervised by Kyle, our qualified swimming instructor – thank you Kyle.



The evening was a success, and many positive comments were received about how families and the local community are brought together to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas.






PTFA


