Maths

Fractions, Mass and Capacity

Computing

Learners will develop their understanding of what a branching database is and how to create one. They will use yes/no questions to gain an understanding of what attributes are and how to use them to sort groups of objects.

Geography

Land Use

In this unit, children will learn about the places around them and begin looking for land-use patterns. Children will investigate their local area, focusing on its facilities and transport links. Children will also learn different ways of presenting, analysing and evaluating the data collected about their locality

RE

What do Christians learn from the creation story?

This unit focuses on the stories of Creation and the Fall as two parts of the 'Big Story' of the Bible. Pupils familiarise themselves with the first Creation story from Genesis.

French

Saying what I and others have

Children will learn words and phrases for items around the classroom.

PSHE

Citizenship

Children develop an understanding of their rights and responsibilities as well as an adult's role in supporting their rights. We will discuss the benefits of recycling and how we can support the local community. We will also look at what democracy means and how it affects us.

English

Class Reading and Comprehension:

Writing:

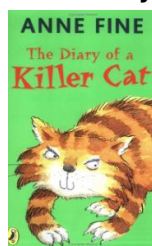
Children will explore the fictional text to write their own **diaries, playscripts and a piece of fictional writing..**

Spelling: This year, children will be set spellings each week with a focus on the Year 3 spelling rules. Spelling shed will be used to help children to learn their spellings and practice them as homework.

Punctuation: Full stops, commas, question marks, speech marks and exclamation marks.

Grammar: Using conjunctions – coordinating and subordinating; expanded noun phrases and using the correct tense.

Diary of a Killer Cat by Anne Fine

Art

Cloth Thread Paint

Children will be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Science

Forces and Magnets

Children will explore how forces move objects. They will be practicing pulling and pushing objects as well as learning how magnets attract and repel objects.

PE/Swimming

Gymnastics – Dance

Children will be learning how to choreography movements with expression and creativity.

Music

Ballads

Pupils will listen to a range of popular ballads to analyse what makes a ballad before learning to sing one themselves.

Homework

Reading: Please share reading at home and listen to your child read regularly, making a note in their planner when you do.

Spellings: These are usually given out on Friday. Children should practise regularly throughout the week on Spelling Shed. Spellings will be tested on the following Friday.

Times Tables Rockstars: please encourage regular practice. Theme homework (please choose at least one):

Geography - Pupils can use cardboard or LEGO to build a model town showing different land uses e.g shops, doctors, school etc.

Science - Children can write a persuasive letter or article explaining why magnets are important for sustainability and how they help address environmental challenges.

Art – Research how cloth is used to create art in modern day society and try to create your own art on cloth.

Music – Find a popular ballad you like/dislike and give reasons for why you like/dislike it.
